The Sega Genesis, known as the Mega Drive in regions outside of North America, is a 16-bit home video game console developed and sold by Sega. The Genesis was Sega's third console and the successor to the Master System. Sega released it as the Mega Drive in Japan in 1988, followed by North America as the Genesis in 1989. The 2012 Hyundai Genesis Coupe is a rear-wheel-drive sports coupe with seating for up to four adults. Available with two different engines, the standard Genesis Coupe is powered by a 2.0-liter turbocharged 4-cylinder engine that produces 210 hp/223 lb-ft of torque while the upgraded Genesis Coupe 3.8 utilizes a 3.8-liter V6 engine that produces 306 hp and 266 lb-ft of torque. With a curvaceous, rakish profile and large wheels, combined with a flamboyant, cockpit-style interior layout, Hyundai's new Genesis Coupe stands out as a good-looking rival to both traditional muscle coupes like the Ford Mustang--and also to more luxurious grand-touring coupes such as the Infiniti G37. The classic Epiphone Genesis was one of Epiphone's most original and modern designs when it was first published in the Epiphone catalog in late 1979. It was intended as a new beginning for Epiphone--a truly original solid body design that could hold its ground with a Les Paul, giving players the added advantage of an eye-catching double cutaway.
