The Zhuangzi (Mandarin: [ʒwɑŋ.tsi]; historically romanized Chuang Tzu) is an ancient Chinese text from the late Warring States period (476–221 BC) which contains stories and anecdotes that exemplify the carefree nature of the ideal Daoist sage. Named for its traditional author, "Master Zhuang" (庄子), the Zhuangzi is—along with the Tao Te Ching—one of the two foundational texts of Daoism. By far the most familiar to most Westerners is the chao gong or bullseye gong. Large chao gongs, called tam-tams have become part of the symphony orchestra. Sometimes a chao gong is referred to as a Chinese gong, but in fact, it is only one of many types of suspended gongs that are associated with China.
